# May 24: Feast of Mary Help of Christians

The devotion to our Blessed Mother under the title "Mary Help of Christians, became known throughout the world, largely due to Saint John Bosco.

Don Bosco had a great devotion to the Blessed Mother. He dedicated to Mary Help of Christians (known in Latin as Sancta Maria Auxilium Christianorum) the mother church of the Salesian congregation in Turin, Italy.

Over the years, as the Salesian Fathers carried out their priestly work in various places around the world, they also spread the devotion to Mary Help of Christians.

Saint John Chrysostom is believed to be the first person to use the title "Mary Help of Christians" in the year 345.

The devotion became widespread in the 1500s when Christians had to defend Europe from non-Christian invaders. Pope Pius V sought the help of Christian armies in defending the continent. He also asked the believers to ask Mama Mary to help the Christians. The victory of Christians and the defeat of the non-Christians was attributed to Mama Mary. Later, in the year 1815, the feast of Mary Help of Christians, May 24, was instituted by Pope Pius VII.

# Saint Joseph the Worker



# Message from our Parish Priest

# A Call to Vigilance

The editorial staff of Simbahay has decided to highlight in this present issue relevant features about a very important event that will happen to our country in a few days time – the Elections of May 10. We are not only citizens of heaven, we are also citizens of this 'earthly city'. We are confident that there is also a rightful place for good citizenship even in the pages of our parish newsletter!

I would just like to reiterate the important points contained in the different pastoral letters issued by the Archbishop of Manila and the CBCP regarding this most crucial exercise of our political right.

- (1) The duty to participate in the elections is a grave obligation for us Catholics as citizens of this country. The elections as a political process is the natural way of forming and transforming the nation and "God is calling us to participate in transforming our society... this is part of our mission as a People of God." We must go out and express our right to vote.
- (2) "In choosing leaders, the electorate should carefully study and match the traits of candidates with the needs and issues disabling the country today. Two major and perennial issues are poverty and graft and corruption." Who among the would-be presidents can best work to solve poverty and corruption?
- (3) On the May 10 elections, "we will freely choose our leaders whom we expect to serve us and whom we will hold accountable for their service to the people of our country." Who among the candidates will truly deserve the title of servant-leaders and would embrace accountability to the people?
- (4) The qualities we seek in our leaders should include persons who are "Godfearing, moral, not given to vices, reverent of life and its deserved decency, consistent true friends of the poor, ever protective of the integrity of the environment, simple and humble and who are good examples for responsible Filipino citizenship." In short, we elect the officials that we can trust because they are trustworthy.

- (5) The Automated Election System (AES) using the PCOS (Precinct Count Optical Scan) machines has proven to be very problematic from the very start up to this last week before the elections. (At least 50% of all tested PCOS machines this week failed to work properly!) "We have to be vigilant and be involved" in scrutinizing the use of the AES and resist any form of coercion, manipulation and cheating.
- (6) "Automated elections will not give us good public officials. The leaders of this country will ultimately depend on our wise choice of candidates. Do not be swayed by survey results or political ads! 'Winnability' is not at all a criterion for voting. Follow the dictates of your conscience and vote for the good of our country and your children's future."
- (7) As Catholics, we should uphold a very fundamental right that needs to be adhered to by our future leaders, and that fundamental right is the right to life. Needless to say, our Catholic faith impels us to select candidates who profess to respect life from conception and who disavow any form of disrespect or violence to human life in any form.
- (8) And lastly, "more than just a well-informed decision, your choice should be accompanied by reflection and prayer."c

Let us be ever vigilant for our country and our people. Together let us be involved in the coming elections. Let us vote wisely after much prayer and continue to implore God to bless our beloved land.

# Pentecost Sunday: Birthday of the Church



PENTECOST SUNDAY, which falls on May 23 this year, is a feast of the Catholic Church which commemorates the Descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, 50 days after the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.

It is also called Whitsunday because of the white garments worn by those baptised during the vigil before Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost ("Pfingsten" in German) is a Greek word meaning "the fiftieth."

Pentecost Sunday is also known as the birthday of the Catholic Church because it marks the Coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles.

# **Our Lady of Fatima**

Our Lady of Fátima is a title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary because of her apparitions to three shepherd children in Fátima, Portugal in 1917.

For six consecutive months in 1917, on every 13th day of the month, starting on May 13, the Blessed Mother appeared to Lúcia Santos and her cousins, siblings Jacinta and Francisco Marto.







#### Reminders

### **BEFORE ELECTION DAY**

- (1) Check your name and voting precint number by logging on to: www.comelec.gov.ph
- (2) Prepare a list (a guide or kodigo) of persons you will be voting for.
- (3) Practice shading. To download a SAMPLE BALLOT, please go to the Saint John Bosco website: www.sjbmakati.com

#### ON ELECTION DAY

- (1) Be prepared to fall in line and wait. Make sure that you are sufficiently nourished and hydrated. Wear comfortable clothing. Avoid wearing shirts or paraphernalia promoting any candidate or you may not be allowed to vote.
- (2) **Do not OVERVOTE**. You may undervote (you are allowed NOT to vote for every vacant position) but you may not OVERVOTE or the ballot will be considered spoiled. Overvoting means voting for more people than what is required (i.e. voting for three persons when only one is needed).
- (3) **Do not OVERSHADE**. Shading intensity (whether light or dark shade) is not important. What's important is to avoid OVERSHADING (shading the area outside the oval) because your ballot may become invalid.

Acceptable shading:



- (4) Strictly follow the procedures in using the PCOS machine. Election officials and technicians will be on hand to help you on election day.
- GO OUT and VOTE on May 10, 2010. Vote for the right leaders who will work for the good of every Filipino, as God desires.

# Saint Dominic Savio, Patron of Choir Boys


Saint Dominic Savio (in Italian, Domenico Savio; April 2, 1842— March 9, 1857) was a student of Saint John Bosco.

Saint Dominic was studying to be a priest when he became ill and died at the age of 14, possibly from pleurisy.

Don Bosco had very high regard for his student, that he wrote a biography about him, "The Life of Dominic Savio." The book speaks about the heroic virtues Saint Dominic displayed in his daily life.

This book became the basis for the Church to consider him for sainthood.

Saint Dominic was canonized in 1954 and became the youngest non-martyr saint.
